- Women's Shiloh House in Jamaica Plain (16 beds)
- Women's Hello House in Dorchester (24 beds)
- Men's Hello House - Burt Street, Dorchester (16 beds)
- Men's Hello House - Mass Ave, South End (24 beds)

Eligibility:

- 18 years old or above
- Identify with the gender of the program
- Have a diagnosed SUD and diagnosed mental health condition

And one of the following **within 90 days:**

- Inpatient psychiatric hospitalization
- Two emergency room and/or behavioral health emergency services program visits
- Been to multiple Clinical Stabilization Services (CSS), Transitional Support Services (TSS), or residential recovery programs within the past 90 days

What We Offer:

VOAMASS understands that you are a **whole person** and should be treated as one.

Our model provides **wraparound care** that addresses a range of needs. We offer access to medication for opioid use disorder (MOUD), therapy, employment and housing services, linkages to primary care and other providers, recovery support navigators, and recovery coaches - among many other services. Think of us as your **“one stop shop”** at the start of your road to recovery.
